From being viewed primarily as a funding mechanism for local health and human service organizations, our United Way of Bristol TN/VA has evolved into an organization that provides critical services and programs to those in our community who need us the most!

YOU trusted us to always have our finger on the pulse of the needs in our community. Because of your generous gifts of time, talents and financial support, you have enabled us to help thousands of people over the years to become stable, employed and self-sufficient. Because of YOU, others look to us to meet the needs of our most vulnerable pop-ulation while developing programs that will not only meet the needs of our community today but in the future as well.

With a staff of three full-time and one part-time employee, along with our community volunteers, numerous committees and our outstanding board of directors, United Way of Bristol accepts the challenge and works every day to provide the resources and support for our struggling families and individuals to help them overcome barriers that prevent them from living healthy, productive lives.

We receive more than 350 calls each month (601 calls in August 22!) from homeless families/individuals looking for emergency and permanent housing, from people struggling to pay their rent, utilities and provide food and other basic necessities for their families. Because of YOU, we have built partnerships with hundreds of organizations across the region that allows us to cut through the red tape and help our families more quickly, efficiently and effectively than ever before. It's not just about helping them access the resources to pay their rent, or find permanent housing, it's about digging deep into each person's situation and putting together a creative, effective plan for them to navigate their current situation and help them on a path to stability and ultimately self-sufficiency.

We have seen many changes in our area over the years, yet one thing remains the same: the tremendous support and generosity that our donors, volunteers and our community exhibits every day. It is because of YOU that United Way of Bristol is able to continue to meet the growing needs of our community and to make Bristol a better place to live.







The Evolution of United Way of Bristol TN/VA

In 1941, United Way of Bristol began as a funding resource for non-profit service providers. The organization raised funds and distributed them to local agencies that delivered direct client services. Today, United Way of Bristol raises funds for specific focus areas including Basic Needs, Financial Stability, Health, and Education.

In addition to the "programs" provided by our agencies, with your support United Way of Bristol makes a big impact in the community with a host of direct services. Delivery of these services is managed by our 3.5 United Way staff members.

Bristol Community Unsheltered Coalition

The United Way of Bristol and the **Bristol Chamber of Commerce** are working with our entire community to develop a comprehensive response plan that ensures homelessness is prevented whenever possible and provides shortterm emergency shelter and rehousing support whenever needed to ensure homelessness is a rare, brief, and one-time experience.

Community Unsheltered COVID Quarantine Program

This program developed by UWB, provides a safe, monitored quarantine environment for any unsheltered person(s) who tests positive for COVID. We provide transportation by ambulance, all meals, toiletries, medications and other resources they need while recovering. We work with the patient to develop an exit plan as well.

BACKPACKS PROVIDED

ALICE, an acronym for Asset Limited, Income Constrained, Employed, is a new way of defining and understanding the struggles of households that earn above the Federal Poverty Level, but not enough to afford a basic household budget. ALICE could be your child care worker, your parent on Social Security, the cashier at your supermarket, the gas attendant, the salesperson at your big box store, your waitress, a home health aide, or an office clerk. Since 2009, United For ALICE has shed light on the everyday struggles of ALICE (Asset Limited, Income Constrained, Employed) households. The ALICE in Focus Research Series takes this data to a new level, spotlighting the struggles of people in specific ALICE populations, including children, people with disabilities, and military veterans.




